



ANNOUNCEMENT SCRIPTS

HOW TO USE:

These five brief scripts inform students about free money for community college, public or private university or career training through the Michigan Achievement Scholarship. These funds are available exclusively to Michigan graduates, no matter their GPA or high school achievements. Please encourage all teachers to read one of the provided scripts at the beginning of their first class of the day, for one week, so that all five scripts are read.

MONDAY:

Hey, seniors, the Michigan Achievement Scholarship has free money for college or career training. It's not about your GPA or extracurricular activities. It's about your future. Learn more at [MI dot gov slash Achievement](http://MI.gov/slash/Achievement).

TUESDAY:

Hey, seniors, you can get an associate degree tuition-free at a local community college through the Community College Guarantee, part of the Michigan Achievement Scholarship Program. You're eligible no matter your GPA or your family's income. All you need to do is fill out your FAFSA. Visit [MI dot gov slash Achievement](http://MI.gov/slash/Achievement) for details.

WEDNESDAY:

Seniors, the Michigan Achievement Scholarship can give you up to \$27,500 for your bachelor's degree at a Michigan university. Seven out of 10 grads may be eligible, no matter their GPA. To apply, just complete your FAFSA. Go to [MI.gov slash Achievement](http://MI.gov/slash/Achievement) to learn more.

THURSDAY:

Seniors, the Michigan Achievement Skills Scholarship can give you up to \$2,000 for career or skills training to start off a high-paying career. Just go to [MI dot gov slash Achievement](http://MI.gov/slash/Achievement) and choose an eligible career training program to get started.

FRIDAY:

This week, you've heard a lot about the FAFSA. That's because it shows you what's possible. If you're thinking about community college, university or even career training, fill it out. If you're not sure what you're doing next year, fill it out anyway. This year, Michigan seniors can access more money than ever before, but a lot of it is first come, first served.
